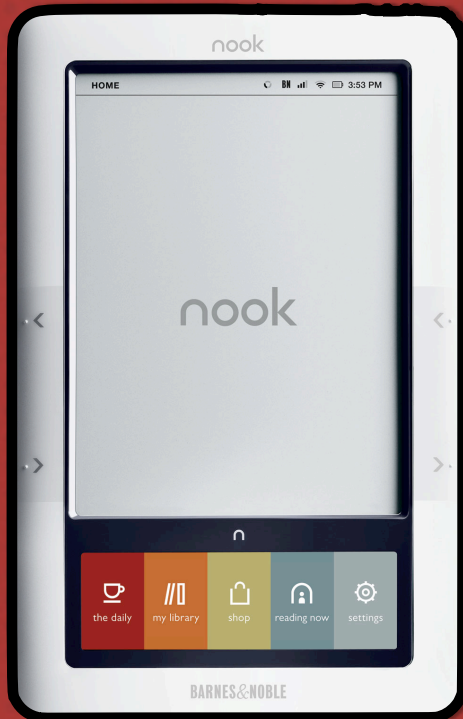

Why we like it - Selling Points

Partial color touch screen for input and style, yet reader portion is great e-ink technology.

In the middle for size (7.7" x 4.9") 6" display.

In the middle for weight (11.6 oz.).

Mechanical and touch swipe page turning options.

Works with Overdrive for access to the library's collection of ebooks.

Pros & Cons

Pros:

- ✿ E-ink display is just like reading a printed page, no glare.
- ✿ Adjustable font size, font type, spacing and background color.
- ✿ Average battery life (up to 10 days).
- ✿ Relatively low price \$149.
- ✿ Reading Now Button keeps track of what book you are reading and where you left off.
- ✿ Ability to share certain ebooks with LendMe Feature.
- ✿ As with most readers now starts with 1500 ebook storage expandable, microSD memory card, to up to 10,000 titles.
- ✿ Built in Wi-Fi (easy to shut off and turn on???)
- ✿ Password protection to prevent unauthorized use purchases.
- ✿ Can be set with a login screen.
- ✿ Play your own music or stream Pandora Internet Radio
- ✿ Use to listen to audio books
- ✿ Built in Dictionary to look up words as you read
- ✿ Has a clock at the top of the screen

Cons:

- ✿ Not a full touch screen (only the 3 inch bottom screen is) and that screen is often too small for what needs to be presented.
- ✿ Internet is not easily navigated because of the small touch screen
- ✿ Slight delay when turning pages
- ✿ No text to speech feature
