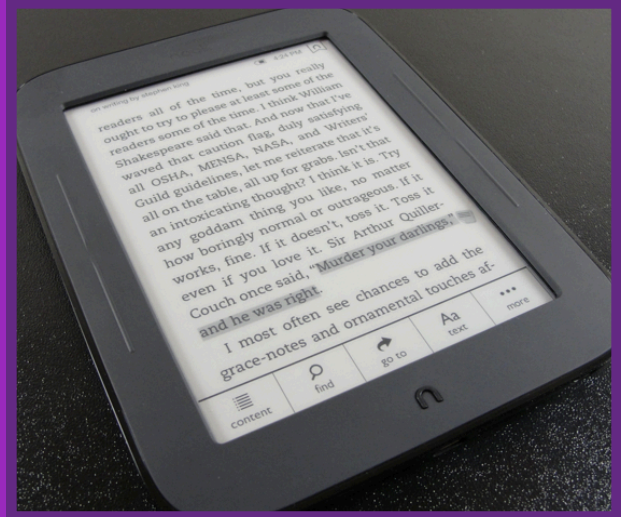

Pros & Cons

Pros:

- * Touch screen with page turn buttons on right and left.
- * Read in Bright sunlight with no glare using E Ink technology.
- * Adjustable fonts and font size.
- * The lightest ebook reader around! Under 7.5 oz.
- * Built in WiFi.
- * Built in Dictionary.
- * Soft touch, textured back is comfortable to hold.
- * Nice sized 6" screen.
- * Can highlight text and create notes.
- * You can turn the page by pushing the side buttons, tapping on the side of the touch screen or swiping you finger across the screen.
- * The side buttons are easy to push but hard enough to eliminate accidental page turns.
- * Automatically saves your page on what you are reading.
- * You can share titles and text with friends via Facebook or Twitter.
- * New e-ink technology vastly cuts down on page turn flashes.

Cons:

- * Must use a book light to read in the dark.
- * Only Black and White, no color.
- * Touch Screen keyboard is a tad slow.
- * Screen still flashes every 6 pages.
- * Still very difficult to navigate around in magazines or newspapers.
- * Need more light to read well than needed for a book.
